Ticò Luigi e De Pauli Emilio dichiarano di recarsi ad Altoona, mentre la DE Santa Cecilia in Dorigo assieme alla primogenita Agostina, dichiara di recarsi a Masontown dal marito Luigi. La figlia Dorigo Agostina erroneamente registrata con il nome di Agostinoi di sesso maschile.
