### LOCAL OPTION BILL STIRS LEGISLATION

Liquor Interests Said to Be the Lookout for a Place to Strike.

### TO ABOLISH SPRING ELECTIONS

Harrisburg, Pa., Feb. 3.—The local option bill prepared by the Pennsylvania anti-saloon league was introduced by Mr. Fair of Westmoreland in the house of representatives. The bill provides that wherever 10 per cent of the electors of a borough, township or city present a petition to the county clerk for an election to determine whether liquor should be granted the county shall hold an election.
