PETITION FOR NATURALIZATION

to the Honorable the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Pennsylvania:

The petition of Marshall Zattiero, hereby filed, respectfully sheweth:

First. My place of residence is 1612 Penn Ave., Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Second. My occupation is Laborer.

Third. I was born on the 6th day of November, anno Domini 1887, at Forni di Sopra, Italy.

Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Havre, on or about the 15th day of March, anno Domini 1901, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 26th day of March, anno Domini 1901, on the vessel La Champagne.

Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 20th day of January, anno Domini 1911, at Pittsburgh, in the U.S. District Court of Western Pennsylvania.

Sixth. I am married. My wife's name is Elizabetta; she was born on the 17th day of June, anno Domini 1888, at Forni di Sopra, Italy, and now resides with me at Pittsburgh, Pa.

I have 5 children, and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows:

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel III, King of Italy, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.

Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least, immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the day of 26th March, anno Domini 1901, and in the State of Pennsylvania, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 27th day of March, anno Domini 1901, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (I made petition for citizenship to the Court of Pittsburgh, on the 20th day of January, anno Domini 1911, and the said petition was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit, and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

Attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.

the said petitioner is a person of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and that the petitioner is in every way qualified, in his opinion, to be admitted a citizen of the United States.
