I, ARTHUR PAVONI, aged 39 years, occupation stone mason, do declare on oath that my personal description is: Color white, complexion dark, height 5 feet 10 inches, weight 165 pounds, color of hair chestnut, color of eyes light brown, other visible distinctive marks None.

I was born in Forni di Sopra, Udine Province, Italy, on the fourth day of July, anno Domini 1886; I now reside at 1910 West Seventh Street, Wilmington, Delaware.

I emigrated to the United States of America from Havre, France, on the vessel "Provincia"; my last foreign residence was Forni di Sopra, Udine Province, Italy.

It is my bona fide intention to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state; or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel III, King of Italy, of whom I am now a subject;

I arrived at the port of New York, in the State of New York, on or about the 15th day of February, anno Domini 1909; I am not an anarchist; I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy; and it is my intention in good faith to become a citizen of the United States of America and to permanently reside therein:

First. My place of residence is 1910 West Seventh Street, Wilmington, Delaware  
Second. My occupation is stone mason  
Third. I was born on the 4 day of July, anno Domini 1886, at Forni di Sopra, Udine, Italy  
Fourth. I emigrated to the United States from Havre, France, on or about the 8 day of February, anno Domini 1909, and arrived in the United States, at the port of New York, on the 13 day of February, anno Domini 1909, on the vessel "La Provence"  
Fifth. I declared my intention to become a citizen of the United States on the 21 day of September, anno Domini 1915, at Wilmington, Delaware, in the District Court of the United States for the District of Delaware  
Sixth. I am not married. My wife's name is [redacted] who was born on the [redacted] day of [redacted] anno Domini [redacted] at [redacted] and the name, date and place of birth, and place of residence of each of said children is as follows: [redacted]

Seventh. I am not a disbeliever in or opposed to organized government or a member of or affiliated with any organization or body of persons teaching disbelief in or opposed to organized government. I am not a polygamist nor a believer in the practice of polygamy. I am attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and it is my intention to become a citizen of the United States and to renounce absolutely and forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state, or sovereignty, and particularly to Victor Emmanuel III, King of Italy, of whom at this time I am a subject, and it is my intention to reside permanently in the United States.

Eighth. I am able to speak the English language.  
Ninth. I have resided continuously in the United States of America for the term of five years at least immediately preceding the date of this petition, to wit, since the 13 day of February, anno Domini 1909, and in the State of Delaware, continuously next preceding the date of this petition, since the 14 day of April, anno Domini 1910, being a residence within this State of at least one year next preceding the date of this petition.

Tenth. I have not heretofore made petition for citizenship to any court. (made petition for citizenship to the Court of [redacted] and the same was denied by the said Court for the following reasons and causes, to wit: [redacted] and the cause of such denial has since been cured or removed.)

attached hereto and made a part of this petition are my declaration of intention to become a citizen of the United States and the certificate from the Department of Labor, together with my affidavit and the affidavits of the two verifying witnesses thereto, required by law. Wherefore your petitioner prays that he may be admitted a citizen of the United States of America.
